Research Title- TeaNet8: A real time Android application-based Tea Leaf Disease detection using fine-tuned transfer learning and Gradient-Weighted Class Activation Mapping visualization

Researchers at Daffodil International University have developed TeaNet8, an Android app that uses AI to detect and classify eight types of tea leaf diseases with 97% accuracy. The app helps farmers identify infections early, reducing crop damage and supporting sustainable tea production in Bangladesh.

"Comparison is the thief of joy."

We've all been there-at a family wedding or social gathering where, instead of enjoying the moment, someone casually drops a comparison that stings. "Your cousin is younger but already married." "Look at his career growth!" "She was always better in studies."

Though often said without much thought, these remarks can feel like heavy blows to our confidence.

Comparisons regarding behavior, career, property, or lifestyle are prevalent in our society. Unfortunately, these comparisons can create negative effects on an individual's mental health. They often lower self-esteem, foster feelings of inadequacy, and generate thoughts such as "I am not good enough" or "I will never succeed." As a result, many individuals begin to avoid social or family events out of fear of being judged, or they may find themselves reacting emotionally in ways they later regret.

Since avoiding comparisons completely is challenging, it becomes essential to learn how to safeguard our mental well-being in such environments. The strategies you may follow for that:

- 1. Set healthy boundaries Limit conversations or interactions that make you uncomfortable.
- 2. Communicate respectfully Express your feelings calmly when comparisons hurt.
- 3. Learn to say "No" Decline discussions that affect your peace of mind.
- 4. Focus on your strengths and values Remind yourself of your unique journey and accomplishments.
- 5. Stay positive Shift attention from negative remarks to positive aspects of life.
- 6. Celebrate others' success Acknowledge others' achievements without self-criticism.
- 7. **Practice gratitude -** Cultivate appreciation for the blessings you have.
- 8. **Regulate emotions -** Respond mindfully rather than reacting immediately.
- 9. Seek professional help if needed Consult a counselor or psychologist when necessary.

 - Reusing bottles without washing them.
 - Leaving water uncovered overnight.
 - Filling from "clear" but untreated sources.
 - Dipping cups or hands directly into containers.
- § 4 Simple Ways to Protect Your Health:

Boil for 5–10 minutes before drinking — it's the cheapest life-saver.

Use filters or chlorine tablets if boiling isn't possible.

Always wash bottles/jars before refilling.

Keep containers covered and away from dust or insects.
